# Job Outline - Campus Organiser

The role of a Campus Organiser is to lead and inspire action on their university campus.

This involves organising fellow conservatives and leading them in campaigns supporting the CLF's core principles of limited government, personal responsibility, free enterprise and traditional values.

Being a campus organiser isn't all about serious campaigning though. The CLF has a range of light-hearted campaigns guaranteed to frustrate and annoy the campus left.

Campus organisers should be enthusiastic young student leaders with an ability to inspire their fellow students to take action in a social atmosphere.

## Duties specific to the role will include:

- Coordinating campaign activities (types of activities will vary depending on the campaign)
- Creating interest in campaigns and managing fellow volunteer activists
- Managing media enquiries and promoting the event
- Developing campaign techniques and promotions strategies unique to your campus
- A time commitment of approximately 2-3 hours per week

## Characteristics and skills that successful Campus Organisers need to possess:

- High levels of team leadership and personnel management skills
- Self-motivation and a high level of organisation
- Have an outgoing personality with a passion for conservative values
- Capacity to relate to fellow students and develop working relationships
